



We Need Your Help Keep Our Residents Safe **From Wild Fires**

Every rural fire department must have the ability to mitigate wild fires. SVFD is no exception. We currently have a grass truck that is over 20 years old. Over the last two summers of extreme hot and dry weather this truck has responded to major fires in Freestone, Navarro and Henderson counties. It has been a real challenge to keep the current truck in service. There were several days this past summer where we could not provide the essential fire protection this type of truck provides because of mechanical issues. Our only option at this point is to replace it. Several generous members of our community have already donated a portion of the entire cost of the new truck which is \$57,000. We would prefer to not incur a significant debt to purchase a new truck since we do not typically operate with a lot of capital to cover our essential, routine expenses. If you would consider supporting this project with a donation of any amount it would



be greatly appreciated and will be used to provide an essential service to our community.

While the Solar Eclipse did not draw as many visitors as initially expected, the severe storms and flooding that followed had all County First Responder personnel running ragged.

Freestone County Water Rescue worked high-water calls for most of the day on Tuesday, April 9th.

Teague Fire Department answered more than 15 separate calls, including two residential structure fires, multiple water rescues, trees down, transformer fires, utility lines down, and traffic control.

Thankfully, through all of this chaos, there were no severe injuries reported.

The common thoughts from Freestone County Sheriff's Office, Police Departments, Fire Departments, EMS, Dispatchers, TXDOT, and Commissioners are: Do NOT drive in high water. Turn around, don't drown. You not only put yourself in danger, but also the lives of every emergency personnel. It's not worth the risk. Attempting to drive where you think the road is or was, or going around barricades, and / or ignoring warning signs, could be fatal.

Thank you to all of our First Responders for a job well done and for what you do for our communities on a daily basis. You are all very much appreciated for your hard work and dedication.

What a great reminder, and the perfect time to feature our first responders, medical emergency personnel, volunteer firefighters, and law enforcement of Freestone County, Texas.





The crowd enjoyed music, food, and activities for the kids. The science fair had 65 projects entered by students from Fairfield, Teague, and Dew.







Southern Oaks Volunteer Fire Department was established in 1989 and currently has 30 active members, 10 administrative personnel, 9 EMRs, 1 EMT, and 1 Paramedic currently providing their skills and time to the department.

There are several members who have been on board for more than 20 years.

Five husband & wives pairs serve as Firefighters and/or EMRs.

The department covers about 90 square miles, nearly the whole south side of Richland Chambers Lake, from Southeast County Road 2350, all the way to FM 488, then right to FM 833, and North on FM 488 to US 287, then both directions to the county lines of Navarro and Anderson Counties.



They recently completed the building of a world class emergency helicopter landing pad at New Hope Church on FM 416. It was built by SOVFD members; from the dirt work, building, steel installation, and all electrical and finishing work (above) left-right: Tom Blake, Jeff Grace, Jerry Grimes, Bill Drozd, Danny Pitts, and Harold Steele). The only aspect that was hired out was

the pouring of the concrete. Total cost for this project was \$27,000, funded entirely by community donations. This helipad is used approximately 12-15 times per year.

In July of 2023, the department received a new \$317,000 Brush Truck (right).


