



Learning the Difference: EMS Professionals

What are the different types of EMS professionals?

Texas EMS agencies rely on different levels of EMS personnel to provide life-saving services to Texans.

--Emergency Care Attendant (ECA): ECAs are certified by the state of Texas after the successful completion of a 60-hour course to provide enhanced first aid. They typically work as volunteers or paid members of a local first responder organization, a police department, a fire department, or an EMS agency.

--Emergency Medical Technician (EMT): EMTs are certified by the state of Texas after the successful completion of a 150-hour course to provide Basic Life Support. They often work on an ambulance as volunteers or paid members of a first responder organization, a police department, a fire department, or an EMS agency. They also serve as members of safety teams for organizations such as warehouses and petroleum plants.

--Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT): AEMTs are certified by the state of Texas after the successful completion Support and some Advanced Life Support. After receiving credentials from a local medical director, AEMTs may perform procedures such as Intravenous therapy, medication administration, and provide airway management through intubation or blind insertion devices. AEMTs often work on an ambulance as part of a first responder organization. They also serve as members of safety teams for industrial organizations.

--Paramedic: Paramedics are certified by the state of Texas after the successful

of a 250-hour course to provide Basic Life completion of 1,000-hour training program. After receiving credentials from a local medical director, paramedics perform advanced airway procedures such as surgical airways, CPAP, and ventilator management. Other duties include telemetry and EKG Interpretations, medication administration, and some even provide advanced techniques seen in an emergency department, such as ultrasounds. Paramedics typically work for EMS agencies on ambulances. However, they can also be found working in emergency departments, clinics, and imaging facilities.







Southern Oaks Volunteer Fire Department Fire & Water Rescue

Southern Oaks VFD, whose service area covers about 90 square miles, currently has 31 Active Members, 11 Administrative Members, 7 Rehab Team members, and one member on the Swift Water Rescue Team.

- Many members are husband and wives as well.
- On the crew are one Licensed Paramedic, one EMT, and eight EMR's.
- Members range in age from about 28 to 84.

Current equipment includes one Engine that holds 1,000 gallons of water, two Tankers that hold 1,600 gallons of water each, one Rescue Truck for medical calls, two Grass Trucks holding a combined 850 gallons of water, and one Large Brush Truck that is CAFS (Compressed Air Foam) equipped and holds 1,250 gallons of water and will convert that water into about 10,000 gallons of foam.

They also have a CAFS-equipped Kawasaki 4-wheel drive side by side.
